JULY 28, 2015

The regular meeting of the Municipality of Carlisle was held this evening, July 28, 2015, in the Council Room at Town Hall with Mayor Randy Winkler presiding. The meeting was opened at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Report:

Mr. Licklitter stated that he had nothing this evening.

Mr. Fryman said that there have been a few car break-ins on his street recently and he wanted to reiterate to the public to please keep an eye out for anything suspicious. Mr. Fryman stated that residents can call Warren County dispatch at 937-425-2525 to report any suspicious activity. Mr. Fryman also encouraged residents that when they mow their grass, please refrain from blowing the grass clippings into the street. Mr. Fryman stated that the grass clippings should be blown back into the yard.

Mr. Jewett stated that he had nothing this evening.

Ms. Tankersley stated that she had nothing this evening.

Mrs. Parr stated that next Tuesday, August 4th, the Carlisle Police Department will host National Night Out at Roscoe Roof Park. Mrs. Parr stated that she will be unable to attend due to a scheduled vacation, but she encouraged all residents to come out for the event.

Mr. McIntosh also encouraged residents to report suspicious activity in real time, not after the fact. Mr. McIntosh wished to send his condolences to the Turner family on the passing of Rose Turner. Mr. McIntosh stated that his thoughts and prayers are with the family at this time.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor Winkler stated that National Night Out is next Tuesday, August 4th from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at Roscoe Roof Park. Mayor Winkler said that it is a great event where residents can come out and meet the officers. Mayor Winkler stated that there will be representatives from the Warren County Sheriff's Office and the Carlisle Fire Department. Mayor Winkler said there will also be a parachute team and free food. Mayor Winkler encouraged all residents to attend and stated that the Carlisle Police Department does a nice job every year hosting the event.

Mayor Winkler stated that he spoke with a citizen who said that there are a number of potholes on Oak and Chestnut. Mayor Winkler said that this citizen is a motorcyclist who stated that it is especially difficult to maneuver around the potholes. Mrs. Callahan stated that she and Mr. Dan Casson, the Village's Service Director, had already spoken today about that area and Mr. Casson will be getting the hot cart for patching from Franklin Township in the next few weeks. Mrs. Callahan said that the area of Oak and Chestnut is already on the list to be taken care of.

Mayor Winkler stated that the grass clippings are also a nuisance to our drywells. Mayor Winkler said that the grass clippings in the street are very dangerous for motorcyclists, and said driving over the clippings is like driving over ice. Mayor Winkler encouraged residents to blow their clippings into their yards, and not into the streets.

Manager's Report:

Mrs. Callahan stated that the Montgomery Avenue bridge project is progressing along nicely. Mrs. Callahan said that we anticipate ODOT completing this project on time if the weather holds out. Mrs. Callahan said that the Union Road/Fairview Drive project should begin by the middle of August.

Mrs. Callahan said that Railroad Days is coming up on August 14th and 15th and the parade will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 15th. Mrs. Callahan stated that if residents would like an application to be in the parade, please contact Amy Brown at Town Hall at 937-746-0555, ext. 210.
