Reminder—Remove Vehicles from Village Streets to Allow for Snowplow Traffic

Snow season is upon us. The Carlisle Service Department reminds everyone to follow a few guidelines to make it easier to keep our streets clear and safe.

- * Plowing generally begins when snow becomes 1 to 3 inches deep.
- * Please be patient. Streets are plowed according to their priority and reviewed at the end of each season. Service personnel concentrate on keeping primary roads clear. Secondary priority is given to major residential neighborhood streets. All other village streets will be cleared as soon as possible after a storm is over. As a reminder, the State of Ohio Department of Transportation is responsible for plowing and salting SR123/Central Avenue. Therefore, you may see their trucks out at different times from the Carlisle Service Department during a snow event.
- * Vehicles should be removed from all Village streets in order to allow for the snowplows. A snow emergency is automatically declared whenever there is 2" or more of accumulated snow on the ground. **Any vehicle that is left on a village street during a declared snow emergency is subject to ticketing and/or towing at the owner's expense.**

2017 Village Road Project Schedule

This summer, there will be two major road resurfacing projects in the Village. Traffic will remain open during the resurfacing, but will be periodically reduced to one lane. Construction updates will be posted on the Village website—www.carlisleoh.org—and the Village Facebook page.

- **Beachler Road**—Thanks to a 69% grant award from the Ohio Public Works Commission, Beachler Road will be getting a much needed facelift in 2017. The project will begin near the CSX railroad crossing on Beachler and end just after the road curve on DuBois Road (before Carlisle Crossing Apartments).
- **Jamaica Road**—The Village received a generous 80% STP/ODOT grant to resurface Jamaica Road in 2017. The project will begin near the Central Avenue/Jamaica Road intersection and end approximately at Grigsby Intermediate School.
