Mayor Randy Winkler called the Carlisle, Ohio Municipal Council Regular Meeting of Tuesday, May 28, 2019 to order in Council Chambers at the Carlisle Town Hall building, 760 Central Avenue, Carlisle, Ohio. The meeting was opened at 7:03 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Forum:

Council Report:

Mr. Lamb hoped that everyone had a great Memorial Day weekend. He reminded all citizens about the upcoming Community-Wide Garage Sale weekend to be held on June 14th and June 15th. He spoke with Mr. McIntosh earlier today and he asked that a meeting be requested of the Recreation & Events Committee at the next Council meeting to discuss planning for National Night Out on August 1st. He hopes that Chief Bruck can also attend to offer the department's plans for the event.

Mr. Jewett had no comments.

Mr. Bicknell asked that all community members reach out to friends and family in the Dayton area that were hit with severe storms last evening. He heard reports that areas of Interstate 75 were having to be cleared with snowplows due to the destruction. A local business on State Route 123, Neff's, has had recent fire damage and he hopes that they are able to rebuild or make repairs to get their business back soon. At the last board meeting of JEMS, it was approved to authorize the purchase of three automated CPR machines. These units strap onto a patient to offer the CPR compression motions so that emergency personnel can work more efficiently. The unit will continue CPR without requiring personnel to switch every three minutes during compressions. Emergency personnel will be able to load and transport patients quicker while the units continue CPR compressions consistently.

Ms. Tankersley had no comments.

Mr. Humphries reported that several community members have contacted him with concerns about vehicles speeding in the area of Meadowlark and Bobby. He is asking that the white stop line on Bobby be restriped as vehicles are making more of a "slow roll" in that intersection versus a complete stop. He knows that Franklin Township has a speed trailer. Perhaps the Village could borrow that trailer to be parked at Marie Place or Robert Place and Meadowlark. He encourages all citizens to slow down in these areas. He mentioned that the light is still out on the flag pole for the memorial on Park Drive. Lastly, he offered his thoughts and prayers to those suffering damage from last night's storms up North.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor Winkler has also been contacted by residents with concerns of speeding vehicles in the area of Sunset Drive and Earnhart. Ms. Tankersley explained that the neighborhood around Easter is also having issues with speeding vehicles. Mayor Winkler explained that our police department is

professionally stretched right now and he would appreciate all residents to slow down. He reminded everyone that school will be out soon and more children will be in the area for the summer months. His thoughts and prayers were extended to those residents and businesses that suffered damage in last night's storms. He knows several local business owners that have reported severe damages from that area and he offered his prayers to them.

Manager's Report:

Mrs. Duffy commented that Sunset Drive at the Dupps tracks will be closed for three days beginning June 3 while they continue the sewer line under the railroad. This will connect the new home on Sunset into the current sewer system. On Saturday, June 22nd, Warren County will be holding the second annual Veteran's Appreciation Picnic at ARMCO Park from noon to 6:00pm. This event is open to all Veterans, their spouses and children or grandchildren. The mobile veteran RV will be on site where veterans can acquire their license and/or register for various services throughout the County. Mrs. Duffy expressed her thoughts and prayers to those impacted by last evening's storms and tornadoes. This is a great reminder to have a prepared emergency plan for your family. For those new to the Village of Carlisle, most of the area is on well water and wells will not work without power. If your power is lost in a storm, you will not have access to running water. Please plan accordingly and have extra water in storage for such emergencies. Losing power during a storm is always a challenge but most people do not think about losing water when there is no power. Those on wells need to make these emergency plans.
